## SECTORAL DATA SPACES AND TRANSPARENCY IN THE PUBLIC SECTOR

The Faculty of Law of the University of Alicante hosted, (1st and 2nd June), the International Congress on Data Spaces and Transparency in the Public Sector, a meeting co-organised by the universities of Alicante and Murcia with the participation of the Chair of Good Governance and Transparency between the University of Alicante and the Regional Ministry of Participation, Transparency, Cooperation and Democratic Quality.

This international congress is part of the Ministry's Challenges Project PID2019-105736GB-I00DER: Open data and reuse of public sector information in the context of its digital transformation: adapting to the new regulatory framework of the European Union.

This is the first meeting of its kind to address the necessary regulatory adaptation to the use of open data in the European Union. In the words of Rubén Martínez, "with this international congress we are trying to position the universities of Alicante and Murcia as a benchmark in legal data studies", a branch that has just been launched in Europe.

During the two days of the international congress, different speakers addressed issues such as the revision of transparency regulations, the configuration and regulation of open data or the limits and legal conditions in open data spaces.

Dolores Ordoñez was one of the guest speakers at the round table "Sectoral data spaces: tourism" where she had the opportunity to present the Dates project from the point of view of data governance, stressing the legal aspects. She explained what are the key elements for governance: ownership, privacy and data security, transparency in data collection and collaboration (standards and protocols). What is the regulatory environment for data in general and for tourism in particular. The different existing directives, data governance models, Open Dei's contributions in the areas of governance and potential structure. As well as the contractual/transactional dimension and the code of conduct for data sharing in tourism.
